Motion to Save a Tree

Judge -

In my complaint I've referred to numerous trial exhibits yet to be reviewed by all. They comprise Plaintiff Exhibits P-1 through P-9. I anticipate other major exhibit classes of documents through P-13, or more. In .pdf form, I have 7,030 pages in my current litigation files. I'm attaching an index of currently planned trial exhibits including the filename, it's source and relevance, number of pages, and size in kilobytes.

You'll note that these files break down into two major classes 1) information unique to my own situation; and 2) information publicly available through many sources, including court cases and judgments, regulations, informational articles and opinions of others of relevance. Class one is unique information that I would like to electronically file through the CM/ECF system. Class two comprises useful knowledge that may be familiar to most of us, certainly cases and

regulations, maybe less so for various articles. There's a nice article by Benjamin Wagner in the US Attorney Bulletin of May 2010, and we all know he finalized the JPM Chase/consent judgment many years later out in California. Probably, we've all read it, but we should all note it. I would surmise that 12 of 12 of the jury panel have not read it, or aware of it. I would be remiss in not filing it.

I'd like to propose a middle ground at this stage of filing. I'd like to file all of the specific information pertaining to myself, one of ~59,999 plaintiffs. I naturally waive all claims of privacy. I'm easily identifiable, and I work in the public interest. I'd like to file the first page of the publicly available information (highlighted in yellow in my index), and incorporate the document by reference. For instance, the CFPB Final Rule for Integrated Mortgage Disclosures runs to 1,888 pages and 17.4MB. It's published in the Federal Record, and everywhere, and anyone with idle curiosity can quickly find it in many places. Mortgage fraud is widely discussed on the internet. For convenience, I have all these publicly available documents on my own website, and they are feely available to anyone. We may not discuss every paragraph of the mortgage regulations, but we will discuss a great many. The jury may have curiosity about others, while they are deliberating. If we adopted this suggestion, I would file a few hundred pages, and we would all be quite well informed on both the facts and the issues.

We will eventually consider a third class of information, that information which we unearth during discovery and deposition. I think it's too early to imagine the best way to present that. I know that for every problem there is a solution, and good men will find a way.
